5. Statement

Moderator

The presiding minister says:

We meet today as the East Midlands Synod of the United Reformed Church,

in the company of members of the churches of the South & East Leicestershire Area

and friends from far and wide, including those joining us by virtual link.

We welcome you all.

Christians share, through their baptism, in the ministry of Christ.

The life of faithful discipleship begins with worship, study of the Scriptures and loving service.

God gives a variety of gifts, from the same Spirit, and calls each of us to serve according to our gifts and the needs of the world. God calls some to be ministers of word and sacraments, to serve the Church as the Church serves Christ.

In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ we have come to induct Martin

to serve as a minister of Word and Sacraments in the South & East Leicestershire Area.

Martin has been called to exercise this ministry by decision of the Church Meetings of Abbots Road and the South Leicester Group

with the concurrence of the Southern Synod.

The interim moderator presents the candidate to the presiding minister with these or similar words:

Moderator, I present to you Martin, for induction into the South & East Leicestershire Area

9. The Call Moderator

We now hear a statement on behalf of the Pastorate, outlining the steps which led to this call.

We shall hear how the congregations of the South & East Leicestershire Area called Martin to be *their* minister.

Firstly, we hear from the Ordained Ministry and Churches Group – the body with responsibility for the deployment of ministers across our Synod – the steps that led to the formation of this new pastorate: **Geoff Townsend**

In addressing the problem of a reducing number of stipendiary ministers, the East Midlands Synod has adopted a policy of creating new style pastorates in which one church will be identified as a Resource Church, scoped at 50%, with the remaining pastorate churches becoming the Resource Area and jointly scoped with the remaining 50%. We were mindful that the present Minister of the South Leicestershire Group, Rev Richard Eastman, is due to retire in 2021. Consequently after discussion with the churches involved, it was decided to create a new pastorate, the South and East Leicestershire Area, with Abbots Road becoming the Resource Church and the churches in the present South Leicestershire Group becoming the Resource Area.

Until Rev Richard Eastman retires in 2021 the new Pastorate will have 2 full time stipendiary ministers, although he will not then be replaced. The Ministers will work with the Elders to

work out their respective roles in this interim period. Initially Martin will work largely with Abbots Road and Richard with the churches in the South Leicestershire Group.

12. Affirmations

Moderator & Martin Ferris

All stand as the presiding minister asks the minister-elect to affirm his faith.

1. Martin will you confess anew your faith?

I confess anew my faith in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

I believe that the Word of God in the Old and New Testaments, discerned under the guidance of the Holy Spirit,

is the supreme authority for the faith and conduct of all God's people. I believe that Jesus Christ, who was born of Mary, lived our common life on earth, died upon the cross, and who was raised from the dead and reigns for evermore, is the gift of God's very self to the world. I believe that through him God's love, justice and mercy are revealed and forgiveness, reconciliation and eternal life are offered to all people. And by the grace of God I promise to proclaim this gospel faithfully. I believe that the Church is the people gathered by God's love to proclaim the reconciliation of the world to God through Jesus Christ.

2. What leads you to this ministry?

So far as I know my own heart,
I believe that zeal for the glory of God,
love for the Lord Jesus Christ,
obedience to the Holy Spirit
and a desire for the salvation of the world,
are the chief motives which lead me to enter this ministry.
Relying on the strength of Christ,
I promise to live a holy life,
and to maintain the truth of the gospel,
whatever trouble or persecution may arise.

3 Will you faithfully fulfil the duties of your charge?

By the grace of God I promise to lead the Church in worship,

to preach the word and administer the Sacraments, to exercise pastoral care and oversight, to take my part in the councils of the Church, and to give leadership to the Church in mission to the world. As a minister of the United Reformed Church I promise to seek its well-being, purity, and peace, to cherish love towards all other churches, and to endeavour always to build up the one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I undertake to exercise my ministry in accordance with the statement concerning the nature, faith and order of the United Reformed Church. All these things I profess and promise in the power of the Holy Spirit.

13. Promises

Moderator

The presiding minister asks the congregation:

The promises that follow are the opportunity – here and now – to affirm joyfully the faith of the

Church and your commitment – today and in the days ahead – to the call issued to Martin.

To comply with Covid-19 guidelines this afternoon one voice will respond here in church;

Any and all watching at home are encouraged to SHOUT the response – loud enough for us to hear it in church!

Do you confess again your faith in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

We do. Representative Voice Do you receive Martin as from God, as a minister of Word and Sacraments of the United Reformed Church?

Will you pray for Martin in this ministry, giving *him* due honour, support and encouragement?

We will.

Representative Voices

The presiding minister asks members of the local churches where the minister is to serve:

Members of South & East Leicestershire Area, do you receive Martin as from God, to serve among you and to lead you in your ministry?

We do.

Representative Voice

The presiding minister asks members of the Synod:

Members of the East Midlands Synod,

do you welcome Martin into membership, and promise to support *his* ministry?

We do.

Representative Voice

The presiding minister addresses Richard Eastman:

Richard, in the exercise of your ministry alongside Martin,

Do you promise to support and pray for him as colleague? **Richard Eastman**

14. Induction Prayer

Moderator

The congregation stands for the induction prayer.

God of every perfect gift, we praise you that in every age you call your people to show forth your acts of mercy and love. We give you thanks that you have called your servant Martin to serve you as a minister in your Church, in succession to the apostles and in company with all who follow in Christ's way.

Pour out the gift of your Holy Spirit on your servant Martin as in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ we induct *him* to serve as minister of this Area

Gracious God, dwell with Martin and strengthen the gifts you have given *him* that the ministry and mission of your people may bear fruit.

Inspire *him* in leading worship, in preaching and teaching and service; may the gospel be celebrated when *he* presides at the sacraments.

Bless *him* with love and humility to tend your flock, to feed the hungry, heal the wounded, and find the lost.

Give *him* power and patience to witness with all Christians to your way, and to labour with all people of goodwill for justice and mercy in society.

Watch over *him* in times of trial; in weariness, disappointment, or frustration; and keep *him* from complacency and spiritual pride.

Fill his home with your peace. (Special petitions may be added at this point.)

Give grace to the people of *these churches* that they may accept the service God offers them through Martin. May they work together for the glory of your name.

And may the good work you have begun today be brought to completion in Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you, Father, and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever.
